

ANNUAL LUMINARIA CELEBRATION

The 20th annual University Heights Luminaria Celebration will be held Sunday, December 17th at 6:00pm. To welcome winter and brighten one of the longest nights of the year, we line our sidewalks with traditional Mexican luminarias and invite everyone to take a winter stroll and enjoy our beautiful neighborhood by candlelight.

Luminaria Supplies (bags, sand and candles) will be sold by the Association on Saturday, December 16th from 10-4 and Sunday, December 17th from 12-4, at the neighborhood garage at the Dartmouth end of Harvard. Sets of 5 bags will be sold for \$2, and 5 sets of 5 will be sold for \$8.

The neighborhood looks best when there is a continuous line of lights on each street, so please participate and urge your neighbors to participate. If you have a neighbor who is elderly or infirm who would like to participate, please offer them your assistance.

LIGHTING TIME IS 6 PM

Our luminarias are a tradition borrowed from Mexico. They consist of paper bags illuminated by candles. Sand is used to weight the bag and keep the candle in place. We place them 3' to 5' apart along the sidewalk in front of our homes and light the candles at 6pm. You may also line your driveway, walk or porch if you wish. The candles sold by the association last about 6 to 8 hours and burn out in the sand.

Rain date for Luminaria is December 31st.

OLIVE BOULEVARD IMPROVEMENT GRANT

Does Olive seem a bit gritty and under-developed to you? YOU can do something about it. By signing and mailing the following letter, you can show support for a federal grant to add sidewalks, landscaping, lighting and a bike path to Olive, at no extra cost to ourselves.

University City has applied for a TEA-21 federal grant of approximately \$1.4 million for improvements along Olive Blvd. and development of a system of bike routes throughout the city. Funding is 100% federal money – no tax increase is involved.

Evelyn Shields, the Public Works Director of U City, is looking for public support for this application. Olive Blvd is a state highway; MoDOT has expressed support for the grant proposal and a willingness to work with U City and citizens groups. Grant applications are being coordinated and scored by the East-West Gateway Coordinating Council. They have ten grants to award; ours was scored number 10. Regrading of grants is possible, and there are other proposals very close in score.

Specifically, sidewalks would be added where there are none now. Lighting similar to that around City Hall would be added at several intersections, and landscaping and other esthetic improvements would be installed. For instance, at intersections the asphalt could have the crosswalks colored gold to reflect U City colors and enhance pedestrian safety. Some utility lines along Olive would be buried. Traffic lanes would most likely remian as they are now.

In addition, this grant would fund signs and lane marking for a 10 mile series of bike routes through all parts of U City. A bike corridor connecting to Metrolink stations and the Katy trail is possible (Olivette has funding for a bike route along Olive and Creve Coeur has applied for a similar grant).

Following is a sample letter of support addressed to Evelyn Shields. She will forward them to the East-West Gateway Coordinating Council. They are holding an open hearing in mid-December (date unknown at present, but call 862-6767 for up to date info). This is one of the most exciting things to happen along Olive in years. We passed the first hurdle, but we don't have the money yet. That's why neighborhood support is so important. If you agree with the ideas in this grant proposal, please express your support. SAMPLE LETTER

Ms. Evelyn Shields Public Works Director City of University City 6801 Delmar University City, MO 63130

Dear Ms. Shields:

This letter is in support of University City's application for a TEA-21 grant for transportation enhancements along Olive Blvd. These enhancements would beautify and esthetically unify a disparate stretch of suburban arterial road.

The addition of sidewalks where there are none now would make the area safer for pedestrains visiting businesses along Olive Blvd. Planned improvements in lighting and street improvements would encourage business development Burial of some utility wires and landscaping improvements would significantly improve the quality of life in neighborhoods along Olive Blvd.

People in the northern part of University City have been waiting patiently for a unified Olive Blvd; this grant would be a major step in enhancing the quality of our neighborhoods.

Also included in the grant proposal is money for development of bike routes throughout University City. These routes would encourage alternative means of transportation, and could be linked to Metrolink stations.

This grant proposal should be funded because it will significantly improve Olive Blvd., the major commercial road in University City and its surrounding neighborhoods.
